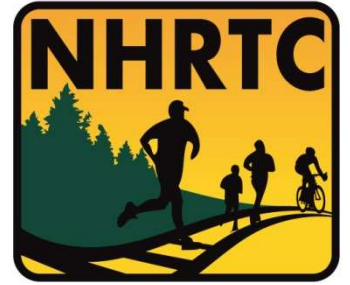

9:30-10:00 **Keynote Address: Supporting Trails in Keene**

Keene City Manager John MacLean--Keene has a unique opportunity to create a municipal trail system based on the rail trails built on the Cheshire and Ashuelot Railroad rights of way. This talk will discuss how the city and local groups worked together to generate trails, what has been accomplished, and remaining work to be accomplished.

10:00-10:30 **Featured Address:** *Carl Knoch of Rails to Trails Conservancy will give the latest view from Washington on Transportation funding. Are the TE, CMAQ, and RTP projects endangered? Will state DOT budgets take a hit?*

10:30-11:00 **Working with the state:** *Charles Martin will report on important personnel changes at DOT and DRED and support from our Congressional delegation.*

11:15-12:00 noon **Raising public and private funding:** *[Panel with Mark Samsel, Diane Hanley, and Bob Mackensie] A variety of techniques have enabled trail groups to raise money from municipalities, foundations, and individuals. This discussion will give you helpful fund raising ideas.*

1:30-2:30 **Recent Accomplishments:** *A lot has happened since our last meeting. This is an opportunity for trail groups to give very short summaries of their accomplishments with brief Q&A and help you figure out who you want to network with.*

2:30-3:00 **Preventing water damage** (Larry Keniston)

When the railroads were operating, they spent a lot of effort to make sure water runoff did not disturb the tracks. Now that effort is gone, and we have multiple small, medium, and large water issues impacting our trails. What can volunteer groups do with little funding? When does the state help?

3:00-3:30 **Hardpack trail construction:** (Alex Bernhard and Bruce Bohannon)
The Friends of the Northern Rail Trail in Merrimack County have six years of experience building hardpack trails with grader or bulldozer and vibratory roller. Swanzey has been working a hardpack project with a paver. What has this experience taught us about hardpack trail quality and costs?

3:30-4:00 **New Hampshire Rail Trails Coalition** - Mark Samsel will lead a discussion of the mission, what the group has accomplished and current plans for the future. Opportunities to work closely with the Coalition. What other issues do you have where you would like help?

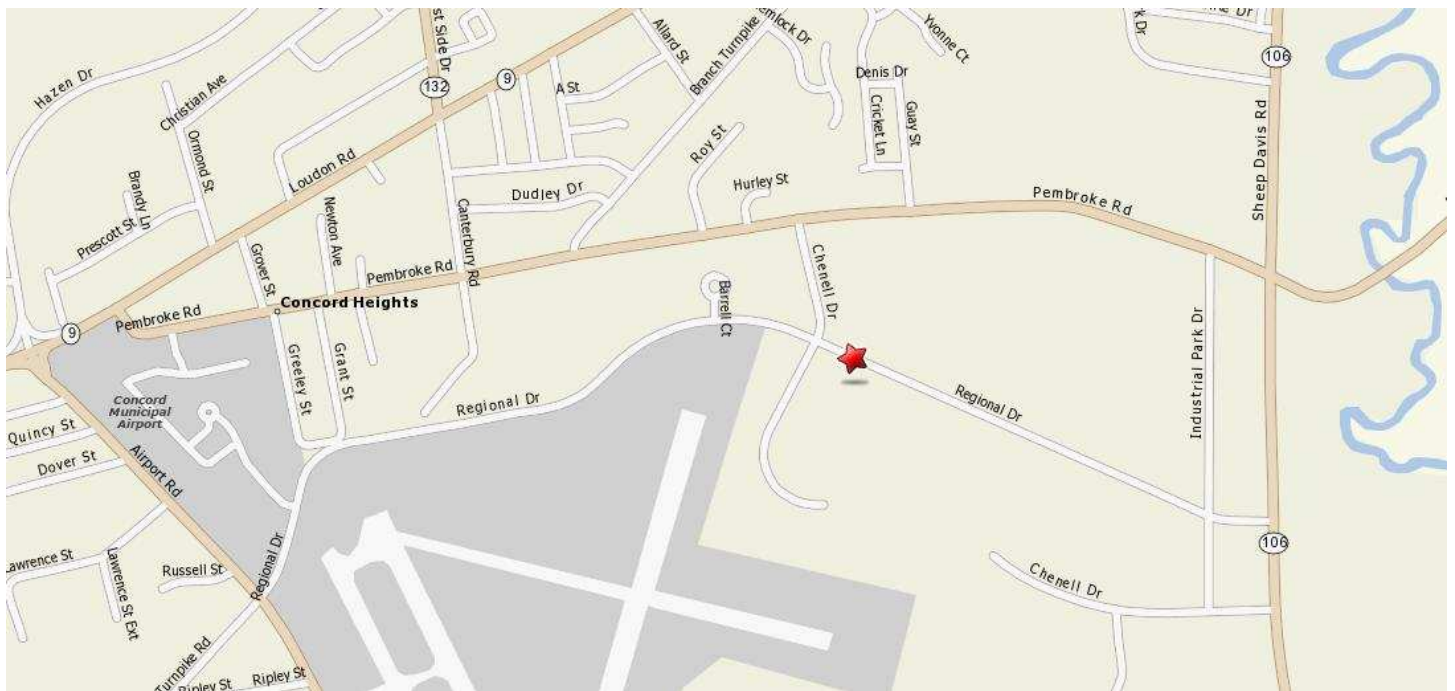
